NAFMNP Basics

The National Association of Farmers' Market Nutrition Programs is a non-profit organization founded in 1992. It is the nation's only organization that links States, the District of Columbia, Indian Tribal Organizations, Territories and others with a stake in USDA's Farmers' Market Nutrition Programs (including local fruit and vegetable growers and low-income families and seniors) with a shared mission.

NAFMNP members and conference attendees include, but are not limited to, Federal and State level coordinators of the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Farmers' Market Nutrition Program, Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program, and/or Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) program coordinators. Their programs reach diverse, multicultural populations within their regions.

Learner-Centered Education

Learner-centered education is an approach that focuses on the learner – not the instructor or content – and involves the learner in decision-making or problem solving. Research shows that adults learn best when what they are learning is relevant to their lives, and when they have the opportunity to DO something with the new information, talk about it, and make it their own. Your audience will be asking themselves, “How will I apply the information when I get back to my state or market?
